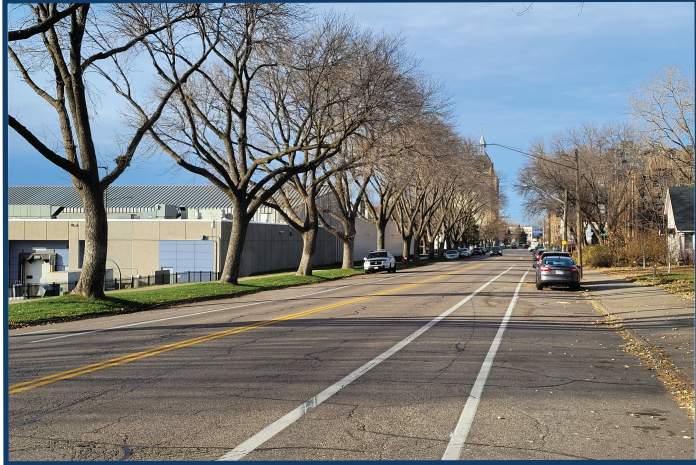


Marshall Street reconstruction

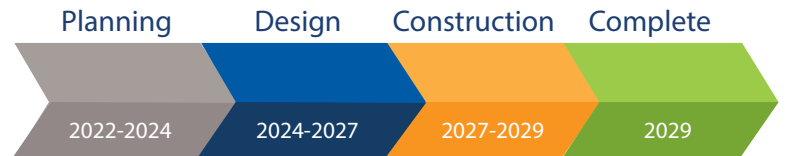
Fall 2025 (phase 3) engagement summary

Project background and schedule

Hennepin County is planning to reconstruct Marshall Street (County Road 23) between 3rd Avenue Northeast and Lowry Avenue (County Road 153) in Northeast Minneapolis. The county is seeking to replace aging infrastructure and improve safety and comfort for people walking, biking, rolling and driving along the corridor.



Fall 2025 (phase 3) engagement

Engagement for the Marshall Street reconstruction project began in Fall 2024. Throughout the engagement process, community members provided feedback on how they travel along Marshall Street and what they want it to look and feel like, as well as which street design elements they prefer.

This feedback was used to help inform the preferred concept for Marshall Street, which was shared with the community during fall 2025 (phase 3) engagement.

Across events during this final engagement phase, project staff interacted with approximately 250 community members and received over 90 written comments.

Preferred concept

Throughout the engagement process, the community expressed a strong desire to see larger sidewalks, a dedicated two-way bikeway, increased green space and traffic calming along Marshall Street. There also was support for on-street parking close to business hubs, and enhanced crosswalks to make crossing the street safer. These community preferences are reflected in the preferred concept, shown below.



Preferred concept feedback themes

Below is a summary of the top themes we heard from community members during fall 2025 (phase 3) engagement events.



Community members expressed general satisfaction with the preferred concept, with strong support for the bikeway and making crossings safer for walkers and bikers.



The majority of community members supported closing 5th Avenue to vehicle traffic, narrowing the roadway at the intersection, and adding in crossing enhancements to make walking and biking to and from B.F. Nelson Park safer.



Community members generally liked the reduction in on-street parking, however some expressed concerns that not enough on-street parking was preserved close to businesses on Marshall Street north of 14th Avenue.

Artist based engagement

In celebration of Northeast's artist community, and in an effort to connect with a young and diverse audience, the project team partnered with local artist, Witt Siasoco, to design engagement materials which encourage respondents to engage with the project in a creative manner.

In earlier phases of the project, Siasoco worked with local students to design yard signs and a mural promoting the project. Over the summer, Siasoco developed a second mural for the project, which was painted by the community at community paint sessions. This second mural will be going up along Marshall Street in Spring 2026.

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback over the last year - your feedback, along with county and city plans, technical needs, and feasibility - helped to inform the preferred concept for Marshall Street. The preferred concept will be presented to the city and county for approval in the coming months. After approval, the project team will be working to further refine the design ahead of construction, which is expected to begin in 2027.

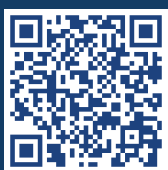
